A PLACE FOR LEARNING, DISCOVERY & COMMUNITY BUILDING


Transformed from its original maritime industrial use, with ample public spaces, a rooftop park, free community programs, and a waterfront market hall – Pier 57 brings an experience filled with food, art, culture, nature, and more to the neighborhood.

At Pier 57, Jamestown runs a series of community spaces at the property. These rooms with flexible layouts are available for booking by local nonprofits, community organizations, cultural groups, and more, and a public gathering place – called the Living Room – located on the southern edge of the Pier's ground floor. Available by reservation only, these versatile, tech-enabled rooms can be adapted for a wide range of program types and group sizes. When not reserved by outside organizations, these spaces are programmed with public events and experiences for the local neighborhood and visitors alike to enjoy.

Community Classrooms Mission

Pier 57 Community Classrooms bring people together by providing a tech-enabled, bookable convening platform for hosting educational and recreational experiences in an open and collaborative environment. Community Classrooms are free to reserve and accessible year-round.

When not reserved by outside organizations, these spaces are programmed with public events and experiences.







Community Spaces

There are three bookable Community Classrooms, two contiguous and one standalone, all with direct access to the Living Room. The Pier's Living Room is a large, public gathering space with views of the Hudson River and Lower Manhattan.

Each Community Classroom is equipped with LED film, which can turn on or off for privacy during events.

Two additional spaces programmed by the Hudson River Park and the James Beard Foundation include 3,000 sf of dedicated community space to host year-round programs and interactive exhibits.


THE EQUIPMENT

The Community Classrooms technology and equipment is designed around a DIY open platform.

Tech capabilities include:

- 98" main presentation display with touch capability for digital white-boarding
- Open platform conferencing by laptop or messaging PC (supports GVC, Zoom, Teams, Skype, etc)
- Wireless and wired microphones, presenter and audience coverage
- Combining/overflow with adjacent or all spaces, audio, and video
- A lectern with built-in technology, removable for non-lectern room use
- Wired and wireless laptop presentation
- Front and back conferencing cameras
- In-ceiling speakers
- Touch screen controllers

Programs

The Classrooms are lightly programmed by the Pier with a variety of events throughout the year. Community partners and programs that we work with include Counseling in Schools to offer adult and child counseling sessions, Children's Museum of the Arts classes, Museum of Math interactive stations, coding classes with The Coding Space, and a variety of interactive programs from Street Labs.

Eligibility

- *Mission-Oriented:* Groups engaged in sustainable, community, educational, cultural, intellectual or charitable activities.
- *Nonprofit Status:* Registered nonprofit organizations will be prioritized for use of the space.
- *Geographic Location:* Enable use of the space to groups from the local region, prioritizing groups within proximity in the local neighborhood.
- *Non-Commercial Use:* Limit the sales of products and/or services that may take place at the event.
- *Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion:* We believe bringing people together with a broad range of perspectives, ideas, and experiences leads to better outcomes. Prioritization will be given to minority-, women-, LGBTQIA-, disability-, and veteran owned organizations as we continue to drive positive social impact.
















Policies & Limitations

- Events cannot be for profit or commercial. Private events are limited to non-profit organizations, educational groups, cultural groups, etc.
- Must be an adult (18+) or have a legal guardian present. Permission of use is not transferable to another individual or group.
- All events must be open to all individuals regardless of age, sex, race, religion, national origin or disability.
- Community Classrooms may not be used for personal social gatherings such as showers, birthday parties, family reunions, etc.
- If an event requires registration/check-in, staffing must be provided by the bookee. An appropriate number of staff will be determined by the Pier 57 team based on the number of anticipated attendees and location.
- Users must secure all legal rights and permissions related to the filming, including other groups occupying the set.
